Checklist: What to Include in a Parenting Plan

Day-to-day activities

- Custody plan: What is the baseline custody schedule between the parents?
- Visitation plan: How will you handle visitation during the other parent's custodial time?
- Dropoff and pickup: How, where, and when will custody exchange occur?
- Transportation: How will children be transported between households?
- Childcare: How will you manage additional childcare, and how will expenses be handled?
- Third-party relationships: Who else (family, friends) can spend time with, transport, or communicate with the child?
- Extracurricular activities: How will you manage extracurriculars, and who will manage expenses? Are any activities off-limits (e.g., tackle football)?
- Children's belongings: Will you have sets of belongings (clothes, toys, gear) at each household?
- Parent dual attendance: How will you manage events that both parents want to attend (e.g., parent-teacher conferences, big games)?

Communication

- Virtual parenting communication: How will you handle virtual parenting during the other parent's custody time?
- Children's media and technology permissions: When can children start using social media? Which platforms?

Healthcare

- Providers: How will you agree on providers for the child?
- Expenses: How will you manage medical expenses between the parents?
- Health insurance: Which parent will assume health insurance for the child?
- Routine appointments and check-ups: How will you manage and attend routine appointments where both parents want to be present?

Child rearing values

- Religion: Will you raise the child under a certain faith? What will that look like?
- Schooling: Will you pursue public or private school? How will you manage expenses?
- Post-secondary education: Is there a plan or expectation for funding post-secondary education?
- **Discipline**: Do you agree to parent and discipline the children according to a certain parenting style? How will consequences be assigned?



Checklist: What to Include in a Parenting Plan

Parental behavior

- Overnight guests: Are overnight guests allowed?
- Significant others: How will you manage a child's time with a parent's new partner? When can they meet, and how much time can they spend with them?

Holiday and vacation schedules

- Holiday custody schedule: Who will have custody during holidays?
- Special dates: How will you manage special dates or events (e.g., a wedding or family reunion) on the other parent's custody time?
- School breaks: How will you manage custody and childcare during school vacations?
- Out-of-area or international travel: How will you manage communication and expenses for out-of-area or international travel?
- Unanticipated schedule changes: How will you make custody decisions in case of unanticipated schedule changes?

Safety

- Safety measures: Do you require any standard safety measures for certain activities (e.g., wearing a helmet when riding a bike)?
- Internet safety: How and how often can the child access the internet? Are there any restrictions on websites or usage?
- Guns or weapons in the home: How will you ensure the child's safety if there are guns or other weapons in the house?
- Curfew: Do the children have a curfew?
- Child solo transportation: When and where can the child transport themselves (e.g., walking, public transportation, or driving to school, activities, or friends' or relatives' houses)?

Additional considerations

- Who will claim tax deductions?
- What happens if a parent has to relocate?
- Which language will you speak and teach at home (if the family is multilingual)?
- What happens if a parent doesn't adhere to a part of the parenting plan?
- How often will you revisit and revise the parenting plan?
